The Clerk-Treasurer's Financial Reports were reviewed and accepted by the Board of Trustees.

- ✓ Unpaid water account balances as of March 31, 2021 will be re-levied onto the Village tax roll for the property, final notices will be sent on February 26, 2021 to all unpaid customers
- ✓ Elections petitions are due by Tuesday, February 9th in order to be on the ballot
- ✓ Friday, March 5th, 2021 is the last day an individual may register with the County Board of Elections to be eligible to vote in the Village Election

The **Public Works Report** was reviewed and accepted by the Board of Trustees.

DPW Superintendent Mark Remington did an inventory of the water meters in stock, which is 14. A quote was obtained from EJP about the cost for switching to radio water meter readers and the software to facilitate the radio reads. Other quotes will be obtained to compare pricing. Maybe something to phase in over time to help save money on 2 ½ days labor to do manual water meter reads.

The Code Enforcement Report

No report submitted

Trustee Davis questioned a property that their fence is leaning quite a bit towards the road on Church Street.

The **Police Report** was reviewed and accepted by the Board of Trustees.

Chief Braughler introduced Officer Jeremey Blair to the Board and audience. Chief discussed the idea of bringing a PBA (Police Benevolent Association) to the Barker Police Department to be able to generate funds to help community members in various ways. This years adopt a family for Christmas had overwhelming response, but unfortunately they were only able to choose two families. This also would allow for fund raising to get the basketball court in David Barker Park on Main Street. Mayor Nellist had several questions about how the organization would work and the structure. Chief explained its in the very early stages of investigating such an endeavor. A copy of the Mt. Morris PBA Constitution and By-Laws were given as an example of the structure. Mayor Nellist stated having an organization like this needs to vet the officers to make sure proper protocols are followed and reports submitted. Chief Braughler stated that maybe the pistol permit classes could be charged a fee for attendance because other classes charge between \$60-\$150 dollar per class. Mayor Nellist stated we would have to check with council to see if this is something the Village can charge.

Trustee Davis inquired as to other NYS grants available for extra detail during crack down weekends. Trustee Davis stated he would like to see the PD utilize as much NYS grant money that is available to make the budget to further. Chief Braughler stated that blitz coverage is hard because our Officer work other full-time jobs and sometimes are unable to fill the shift due to their FT commitment.

Chief Braughler also asked the Board to promote Officer Jeremey Blair to Sergeant position that is currently vacant. A motion to approve the promotion of Officer Jeremey Blair to Sergeant (pending approval from NC Civil Service) was made by Deputy Mayor Corwin-Bradley and was seconded by Trustee Davis.

Public Comment was offered by:

Philip Bates: Mr. Bates began by inquiring about the Village Code about how many unregistered vehicles a residence can have. The answer is one. Mr. Bates stated there are many residences in violation of this along Quaker Road. Mr. Bates also inquired about how many hours the PD patrols a month. Mayor Nellist stated this month 69, which is due to maintaining the personal service line for Police Officers in the budget. Mr. Bates stated that the Town of Somerset PD should not be at the school every day, the school is in the Village and therefore the Village should be the ones at the School. Deputy Mayor Corwin-Bradley stated that the school situation is a contracted Student Resource Officer. Mr. Bates also inquired about how come his Town and County taxes were \$1200 more. Mayor Nellist stated he would have to speak with the Town and County for answers. Mr. Bates inquired about why the money received from the fire be put toward the water bond because the building the Village is operating out of is sufficient. Mayor Nellist stated that insurance money must go to rebuilding, it can not be used for another reason. Mr. Bates inquired about the cost of water from NC and how much the Village charges. Mayor Nellist stated that the Village had to work with the situation delt, half the lines were replaced by a 1.2 million dollar grant and the rest was done by low interest bond. Administrative costs are also associated with water, as well as water operating as its own fund. Tax money does not go to water, water fees pay for water expenses. Mr. Bates stated that Quaker Road is a racetrack and speed enforcement needs to be stepped up.

Board Comment was offered by:

<u>Mayor Nellist:</u> Stated he is dealing with many different things and will be leaning on other Board members to get help between COVID and family circumstances.

A motion for **Adjournment was made at 7:59pm** by Trustee Davis and was seconded by Deputy Mayor Corwin-Bradley.
