Streets:

- Plowed & salted streets, Village Hall parking lot and DPW garage lot
- Streetlights were delivered and stored in metal building

Water:

- Turned in 4th quarter 2022 (Oct-Dec. 2022) water readings to Village Hall
- Emergency dig request on Coleman Road-8:30pm-replacing power pole-water lines were clear
- Dig request at 8739 Main Street-located & marked water service

Equipment:

- Had pickup truck inspected at Hartway Motors
- Recall on pickup truck and dump truck (air bags) Hartway motors will order the parts and set up an appointment when parts come in
- Rinsed off both trucks, salter, and tractor
- Checked fluids in both trucks
- Took plow off pickup truck until needed again

Parks:

- Emptied garbage cans in both parks weekly
- Finished taking down Christmas lights and decorations-stored in metal building
- Disposed of Christmas Tree from Gazebo

Other:

- Wrote monthly reports
- Ran to bank for Village Hall-deposits
- Picked up around the dumpster at DPW Garage after Modern emptied
- Inspection of DPW facilities from Michelle Leroux, NYMIR risk control specialist
- Standish and Jones for supplies
- Returned folding chairs to Ross rentals they missed when picking up the tent and chairs from Light Up Barker
- Met with Mike from Midland paving-estimate for budget
- Had road salt delivered-loaded into lean to with loader
- Covered office at Village Hall for appointment of Amanda's
- Started working on budget and made phone calls to contractors/vendors for pricing
- Met with Nick from LNR Industries regarding the drainage issue at the Barker Lions Club building/grounds-drainage around the building and tie into clay pipe- got estimate from Nick to do complete work. Attended meeting with Lions Club members on 1/18/23 and discussed drainage issues and the steps taken by the Village to locate any issues. Reviewed estimate from Nick and the Lions Club decided to have drains installed to tie into the Village storm drains. Nick started work on the Lions property by digging the 24" clay pipe on top, water began coming up from around the pipe and ground. The clay pipe was blocked by roots from large tree behind the property. Had to replace 60-80' of clay pipe with black plastic drainage pipe. A big thank you to Mike Flint, Somerset Highway Superintendent that supplied drainage pipe and stone at cost.
