Streets:

- Pushed back snow piles with tractor at intersections of streets and along south side of Main Street into park
- Dug hole and installed new post and stop sign – old sign had gotten hit by vehicle – Church Street and Quaker Road
- Street lights completed
- Plowed and salted streets, village, and garage areas

Water:

- Final water read at 1872 Pallister Avenue – house sold
- Backflow device inspection at 1710 East Avenue and 8700 Church Street – houses sold
- Replaced curb box cap at Village Hall – hit by plow
- Read water meters for the quarter

Equipment:

- Removed snow off of police vehicles, jump started with pick up truck – let both vehicles run for awhile
- Ran salt out of salter and rinsed salter and dump truck
- Took snow blower and front bracket off of tractor, disconnected wires, took doors and cab off of tractor – stored away in metal building
- Removed metal brackets underneath tractor that hold snowblower – attached front bracket for mowing deck
- Oil change on pickup truck
- Washed pickup truck and dump truck
- Power washed mowing deck, greased fittings on deck and installed deck onto tractor – ready for mowing

Parks:

- Opened up gate valve to drain water out of skating rink
- Emptied garbage cans in both parks – weekly
- Picked up branches in both parks after high winds
- Picked up debris that was caused by kids in village park

Other:

- Wrote monthly reports
- Pushed back snow piles at Village Hall parking lot
- Board meeting
- Budget meeting
- Replaced recycle bin at 1695 Quaker Road – old one damaged by Modern
- Set up for elections and picked up after elections
- Moved things around in metal building to make spot for cab and snow blower
- Standish and Jones for supplies
