ARTICLE I

Inclusion of Village in Somerset-Barker Sewer District [Adopted 3-4-1968 by resolution]

§ 166-1. Authorization.

The Village of Barker, Niagara County, New York, hereby consents to the inclusion of the entire Village of Barker in the portion of the Town of Somerset to be provided with sewer facilities, improvements, and services, all substantially in accordance with the general map, plan and report for providing such sewer facilities, improvements and services prepared by Leon H. Wendel, Consulting Engineer - Planner, 7405 Canal Road, Lockport, New York, and designated "Sewer District Creation Study for Village of Barker and Town of Somerset, dated August 1, 1967, Project No. 1370-2-67," which general map, plan and report have been filed with the Village of Barker and with the Town of Somerset. Such general map, plan and report provide for the creation of a sewer district to include all of the Village of Barker and that part of the Town of Somerset bounded as follows: South by the village line extended west to its intersection with the west line of Lot 2, Section 10, Township 16, Range 5, then north along the west line of Lot 2, Section 10, Township 16, Range 5, the west line of Lots 1 and 2, Section 11, Township 16, Range 5, and the west line of Lots 3 and 4, Section 12, Township 16, Range 5, to the south shore of Lake Ontario; north by the south shore of Lake Ontario; east by the center line of Fish Creek to its intersection with the east line of Lot 8, Section 9, Township 16, Range 5; then south along the east line of Lots 7 and 8, Section 9, Township 16, Range 5, continuing southerly along the east lines of Lots 3 and 4, Section 8, Township 16, Range 5, and the east line of Lot 4, Section 7, Township 16, Range 5, to its intersection with the south line of the Village of Barker extended easterly.

This article is subject to permissive referendum.1

ARTICLE II Adoption of Regulations [Adopted 7-1-1996 by L.L. No. 1-1996]

§ 166-3. Purpose.

This article adopts the rules and regulations of the Somerset-Barker Sewer District, as adopted by the district on March 12, 1996, and as adopted as Local Law No. 1 of the year 1996 of the Town of Somerset on March 12, 1996, and filed with the New York State Department of State on March 18, 1996,² as a local law of the Village of Barker.

§ 166-4. Adoption and enactment of rules and regulations.

The rules and regulations of the Somerset-Barker Sewer District (which encompasses the entire Village of Barker), as adopted by said district on March 12, 1996, and as adopted by the Town of Somerset on March 12, 1996, as the Town of Somerset Local Law No. 1 of the year 1996 and filed on March 18, 1996, with the New York State Department of State, are hereby adopted by the Village of Barker as a local law of the Village of Barker in their entirety and each and every provision thereof is incorporated into this article as if set forth in full herein so that said law, rules, and regulations shall be in full force and effect in the Village of Barker.

§ 166-5. Penalties for offenses.

The violation and penalty provisions set forth in said law are hereby adopted for so much of said district as lies within the Village of Barker.
